Can I install solar panels without planning permission?

If you live in a house with permitted development rights you can install solar panels without planning permission, subject to certain conditions and limitations. These rights may vary based on location and property type, so you must check with your local planning authority.

Do I need planning permission for a solar PV project?

The rules apply to both solar thermal panels and solar PV. However, permitted development rights do not always apply as there are a few exemptions. If your project falls into one of these, you will require planning permission unless you can make any adjustments to your plans. Exceptions can include:

Do I need planning permission for ground-mounted solar panels?

Most projects involving ground-mounted solar panels - also known as standalone panels - require the property's owner to apply for planning permission. You'll need permission if any of the following criteria apply to your plan: If you ever add to your ground-mounted installation, you'll have to apply for planning permission again.

Do you need planning permission for a solar inverter?

If your home has three-phase electricity, you'll need approval for any inverter with a capacity over 11.04kW. Most UK households won't have to apply for planning permission for solar panels, thanks to permitted development rights.

Are solar installations covered by planning permission?

Solar installations are usually covered by permitted development rights, which enable homeowners to carry out reasonably sized measures without planning permission. The main exceptions are usually flats, listed buildings, homes in conservation areas, and ground-mounted installations.

Can you put solar panels on a building?

Yes, if the installation falls under permitted development. However, if you live in a conservation area or world heritage site you can't put solar panels on the principal or side elevation walls of your house if it fronts a highway. It is always a satisfactory decision to place the solar panels at a place where it gets the most amount of sunlight. In the vast majority of cases, installing solar PV will not require any form of planning permissions. This is because solar panels are (as mentioned earlier) permitted developments (or PD) under the relevant legislation. If you wish to avoid the need for planning permission, the panels must:

Before installing solar panels on a flat roof located on Article 2(3) land, you must apply to your local planning authority (LPA) for prior ...

Class A allows for solar panels to be erected on residential properties subject to a few conditions. The most important factor is that you must keep the solar photovoltaic (pv) or better known as a solar panels or indeed solar roof tiles within 20cm of the wall or slope of the roof. Yes, you can install them on a wall if you want.

If you want to install panels on a flat roof it could cost more, as you may need fixings to hold the panels in place. You generally won't need planning permission. In England and Wales, the Government's Planning Portal says that panels are likely to be considered as "permitted development" - meaning you don't usually need to apply for planning permission.
