If your site isn't a good fit for solar -- bad orientation, too much shade, etc. -- a competent company is going to advise you not to go forward.

A solar panel system typically generates double its "size". For example, a standard "4 kilowatt peak" (kWp) solar panel system could generate around 8kWh of electricity in a day (weather-dependent).
